A few words from Pastor Hawkins...

In order that my annual meeting report reach a wider audience, a summary follows.

The first and most crucial task for the congregation is to realize that the wider church is and has been experiencing great change. For decades St. Matthew's has been accustomed to having pews filled with large extended families. However, families with seven or more children are rare, and extended families are becoming more and more scattered. Plus, the cultural emphasis on attending church each week is no longer operative. While many disciples are still kin to one another the days of sustaining the parish with more family are over.

A few projects are already in the pipeline or have been finished:

- Sunday worship bulletin has been revamped and includes necessary information for guests. Inserts have been reduced in number and information about the wider church is now included.
- Parish files are being sorted into those that need to be kept close at hand and those that are to be archived eventually. (STM's charter issued by the State of South Carolina has been found as well as old insurance policies that must be kept handy.)
- A special congregation meeting will be held January 20 to ratify amendments made to the basic ELCA congregation constitution at 2013 and 2016 Churchwide assemblies.
- A committee has been appointed to study and make recommendations for changing the portions of the constitution that a congregation can modify to fit its particular needs.
- No adult council members were elected this year so as to reduce the size of Council to eight adults and two youth.

Projects yet to be done include:

Review and update the Parish Register

- Evaluate current committee structure for functionality and needs.
- Cleaning, repair, and maintenance closets, disposal of outof-date materials/hardware
- Create storage space for archives and financial records that must be maintained.
- Evaluate signage and curb appeal and establish safety procedures
- Create database of email addresses; establish reliable system to inform disciples of emergency situations.
- Inventory and purchase altar and communion appointments
- Explore ways to reduce expenses: (these are representative examples)
 - Ending ELCA bulletin cover yearly subscription (\$600 saved)
 - Purchase numbered, undated offering envelopes (no waste, cuts cost in half)
 - Use free VBS curriculum downloadable from ELCA website.
 - o Evaluate need/use of church bus
 - Use email to communicate when appropriate rather than US Mail.
- Evaluate and update STM website
- Develop an awareness of the changing demographics of the surrounding community
- Update congregational policies, procedures, position descriptions
- Write and implement Child Safety Policy (mandated by Synod some years ago)



December Council Highlights

- Devotions were led by Doug Whittle. Council watched the 2019 SC Synod Mission Video and discussed it briefly
- Heard that the Sunday School for children will be devoted to the children's Christmas program rehearsal from November 18 until the program date on December 16.
- Heard that the Stewardship Team is reviewing pledge campaign materials.
- Barry Steele, chair of Recreation and Fellowship Committee expressed his thanks to committee members for their work over the past three years.
- Approved the congregation's participation in Lutheran Services of the Carolina's Love One Another capital campaign
- Approved training of communion ministers to distribute communion to disciples who cannot regularly be present at worship.
- Approved recommending the 2013 and the 2016 ELCA Church wide Assembly Amendments be adopted and added to the St. Matthew's Constitution and Bylaws. The amendments will be presented and voted on in a special congregational meeting January 20, 2018.
- Began the process of appointing a Constitution Review/Study Team to review and make recommendations to update the St. Matthew's Constitution.
